Director of Finance and Human Resources- Fara Brock

Fiscal year 2016 was financially a great year for Bethel. I am happy to report that we:

- Successfully refinanced our mortgage at a lower interest rate and renegotiated our copier lease with dramatic savings
- Successfully transitioned the management of the Stelling site to Good Shepherd Christian Community
- Successfully moved our PBX phone service to Comcast with increased internet bandwidth and \$4,500 per year savings
- Sold a donated parcel of land in Siskiyou County for a profit of almost \$22,000
- Ended the fiscal year on August 31st with a net income of \$40,000; with \$85,000 donated to Benevolence and Outreach and with \$201,000 in unrestricted assets
- Ended the calendar year on December 31st with giving 9.4% above budget

I have the honor of working with an amazing group of Bethel volunteers who make a huge difference in smooth operations at Bethel. I am always impressed by their love for Bethel and the knowledge and wisdom they bring to these areas:

- Liz Tribby on managing office computers and member records
- Holly Lofgren on managing capital assets and depreciation schedules
- Brad Martinson on managing school computers and Bethel's internet and telephone infrastructure
- Dave Tribby on general fund budgeting and monthly reporting
- Eric Brown on budgeting and the Council financial dashboard
- Kathy Arnold on leading internal auditing of processes and records

As Bethel's Human Resource manager, I work closely with Bethel's principal, Dawn De Bois-Weber, and Pastor Ben on personnel issues. Bethel has about 50 employees so I am always learning to help keep Bethel compliant with California and Federal labor laws for small businesses. I also work closely with Bethel's benefits broker to offer competitive benefits to our employees. Notable projects in 2016 include:

- Updated Bethel's Employee Handbook for clarifications and the latest labor laws
- Brought 10 new employees on board for the school

- Increased Bethel's dental insurance benefit from \$1,000 to \$1,500 per person
- Enrolled 22 employees in Bethel sponsored medical benefits
- Moved short-term and long-term disability policies to a new carrier saving \$4,000/year

It is a blessing to support Bethel's program staff on HR issues and on funding quality and inclusive programming for Bethel ministries. I look forward to another productive and inspiring year with Bethel's amazing staff and volunteers.

Children's ministry 2016- Amanda Laughlin

2016 was full of fun new and old traditions. In Kid Connection we continued to use the Curriculum "Living Inside Out" for ages 3 years old – 6th grade for winter/ spring 2016. A large group model with games, drama and music and then age appropriate small groups that dove deeper into the lesson. We have twelve volunteer teachers... Amanda Boniface, Lauren Hadding, Patrice Sera, Alice Isaacson, Lynne Stasi, Kristine Liu, Amber Myerholtz, Carol Wheaton, Jamie Laughlin, Brett Deutscher, Greg Steinke, Minnie Sudarsanam and our youth song leaders... winter/ spring 2016 Amelia and Abby Wheaton and fall of 2016 Abby Wheaton. We also have had "All Kid Connection Activities"... which include a "Seder Meal" and a "Pentecost Party", led by Robyn Winegardner. All of these volunteers are what makes our Kid Connection – Sunday school program happen. They give of their time to bless our children with the seeds that help them all to grow in their faith.

A new choir for ages 3 years old to first grade was started in the spring of 2016. This choir is called the "Little Lights" choir. It is directed by Amanda Boniface. Our "Children's Choir", grades 2nd – 6th is directed by Barb Larsen. Both choirs meet during the second service after the Children's Message.

We campaigned for help from the congregation to renovate our Bethel Nursery... thank you! We registered for new toys, books and supplies from Target and Babies R Us and had an amazing Nursery Shower. All decorations were planned and set up by Sue Jacobus and Patricia Myerholtz. All of the gifts were opened by children who have spent time in the nursery and they had a blast! We also asked for monetary donations to help to re-carpet, paint and add new cabinets to the nursery. Bethel members were very generous and also with the help of Men of Monday, the quilters and Tom Hoegel... the nursery was renovated and is a very welcoming place for our younger members and visitors.

Our second annual "Take Out Church", is a fun activity for families and the young at heart to take part in over the summer break. Our theme this year was ... "Be a Jesus loving Llama!" Chinese Food take out boxes were filled with.... Fortune cookies (with bible verse messages of just how we could be Jesus loving llamas), pay it forward challenges, llama post it notes, pens, M& M prayers and llama finger puppets. Everyone was asked to take their finger puppet llamas with them on vacation and take pictures. These pictures were collected and Pastor Ben created a movie of all of the llama's adventures. Pastor Ben and I have a lot of fun coming up with ideas to make this a fun summer project. This project is only one little example of just how supportive and involved he is in providing our children with programs that make our children feel and know that they are important. Stay tuned for this year's "Take Out Church"... we are very excited!

Our Annual Vacation Bible School took place, July 11-15. The theme was "CAVE QUEST" – Following Jesus the Light of the World. We had 75 campers and 40 awesome volunteers who came all week to make this an incredibly memorable experience. For our service project, we collected money which went to "Sunnyvale Community Services" to help those who were displaced from their homes in Sunnyvale when their apartment complex caught on fire. Our VBS kids were neighbors helping neighbors… how cool is that?! Thank you to all of our amazing volunteers who helped prior and during this fantastic and joyous week!

We led an Advent Project in coloring! All ages were encouraged to color large posters that shared the story of Jesus' birth. These posters were available to color on Sunday mornings before, during and after the church services. It was a wonderful intergenerational event and they were displayed beautifully on the wall of the sanctuary for Christmas Eve services. I absolutely loved this activity and loved how people of all ages sat down, became mindful and created a beautiful way to share the story of Jesus' birth!

Our Kid Connection Kids shared the story of Jesus' birth when they performed "A Shepherd's Story" during the second service on Sunday, December 18th. I shared with them that they were the ones teaching that morning... they were the messengers. They took it very seriously and did an amazing job.

Last but not least... our Kid Connection Kids also collected a special offering during the Season of Advent. They collected money to purchase a llama for a farming family in South America. We were blessed when someone who wants to stay anonymous wanted to match our giving... so we were able to purchase two llamas. The children were so excited!

I can't help but look at a child and see Jesus' image. The love, curiosity, joy in the simple things... all of these attributes exude in our Bethel Children. Bethel Choir- David Herberg

Time for a short Bible study! Consider these passages from Scripture:

1 Chronicles 16:9-23, Ps. 5:11, Ps. 9:11, Ps. 30:4, Ps. 32:11, Ps. 33:1-3, Ps. 47:6-7, Ps. 66:2, Ps. 68, Ps. 81, Ps. 96, Ps. 98, Ps. 147:1, Ps. 149:1, Is. 12:5, Is. 42:12, Is. 44:23, Jer 20:13, Jer 31:7, Zeph 3:14, Eph 5:19, Col 3:16

What do these passages have in common? They are all holy commandments for us to be singing. Not just to have singing around, or of the author describing his own response -- there's plenty of other Scripture conveying that sentiment. But rather direct instruction that all people should and must sing to the glory of God.

The All Bethel Choir responds to this call by presenting a prepared anthem each Sunday. Because we have an overlap in membership between the Joyful Noise Bell Choir, we tend to stay out of each other's way. But sometimes we join together for a song, and that is fun! The choir enjoyed singing for the special services too, including Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Thanksgiving (followed by pie; yum!). As in previous years, our Ash Wednesday anthem becomes our Lenten Theme Song, so to speak, and we reprise it as Communion preparation music for the rest of Lent. In the fall, our numbers were down a bit, due to family and travel schedules, but our

enthusiasm remained high. And yes, we are limited to attending just the first service due to scheduling and financial limitations.

The Advent and Christmas concert with orchestra is always well received. The choir works hard on it and the congregation responds well! The Worship Team and Joyful Noise Bell choir participate as well, and we did several collaborations between the groups. While the concert serves as a common showcase for all the homegrown musical talent we have here at Bethel, in the past we have also collaborated with other churches to present the same music at each other's places, building bridges and establishing friendships with Christians of another congregation.

And building bridges and fellowship is what Chorus Magnus is all about. Last June, we again joined Cupertino Chorus Magnus, singing with 5 other churches in celebration of our shared faith. I always get a powerful feeling of unity and closeness to God when all these Christians lay aside traditional differences and come together in common worship singing His praise. By now I should no longer be as surprised as I am each year! Each singer comes away with their own highlight -- for many it was Bethel's contribution *Face the Cross* -- and new friendships. The latest Chorus Magnus raised \$3800 in contributions, which was donated to West Valley Community Services for non-monetary aid to the needy in our own local community.

I'm grateful for the opportunity once a year to sing the liturgical components of the Lutheran worship service using the corresponding elements of the Latin mass. This has opened up to us a wealth of history's greatest music, and simultaneously demonstrates the constancy and faithfulness of God through out the centuries. In the past, we have performed the music of Schubert, Haydn, and Mozart.

In 2016 we introduced the most challenging work we have ever attempted, a setting of the same words in a contemporary African style. I believe this work celebrates the omnipresence and timelessness of God by combining the identical ancient text with music that is geographically diverse. This year we look forward to presenting music from our own California history, music composed right here centuries ago and nearly lost in the meantime: *Misa de Cataluña* was important in the early California Missions.

These special events all have another benefit that dovetails directly into our Hospitality Core Value. These exciting special events draw visitors from outside the Bethel family to participate in them. Each of these special projects have attracted singers who are members of other congregations, as well as the unchurched. Forming a welcoming and inspiring time together brings nonmembers into our campus and builds bridges to the community.

As director, I'm continually impressed and blessed by the continuous improvement of the singers. Their sight-reading of intricate melodies and rhythms often blows me away. With their skill and dedication, we are able to sing more and more interesting pieces, to the glory of God and the fun and sense of accomplishment to the singers.

The one thing that continues to disappoint me is the great number of wonderful singers we have in the congregation, who choose not to sing in the choir. If you are reading these words, know that they apply to you. As well as do the repeated Scriptural commands in today's Bible study. I hope you realize what an important ministry the choir is to the congregation and will join us for the next season.

I look forward to another musical year of Bethel music! With the upcoming California Mission *Misa de Cataluña*, the next Chorus Magnus, and every Sunday morning, I hope to inspire the congregation and exalt our Lord.

Bethel Lutheran School Update- Dawn De Bois-Weber


The school has had a very productive year. Our current enrollment is 144 children. We updated our mission statement to be; *Bethel Lutheran School teaches children to be active learners and Christian leaders in a hands-on, safe and supportive environment.* We implemented a STEM & Science program for grades 2nd-4th. A highlight of this class was borrowing an electron microscope from Hitachi. The children were able to see objects magnified at 10 million times their normal size. On our Fall standardized test, all students placed on or above grade level in the areas of reading and mathematics. We hosted several community events with attendance ranging from 50-225 people. Some events included Paint & Pinot and Trunk or Treat. We put our faith in action by donating 50 pounds of candy to active military and a local food pantry. The children assembled and donated over 250 Ziploc bags of hygiene items and snacks to Our Daily Bread, a homeless program and replenished the bin in the foyer for Bethel families. Additionally, the 2nd-4th grade went to Our Daily Bread and washed fruit, set up tables and chairs and decorated to prepare for the meal service of 400 people.

Working at Bethel is an honor to continue the legacy that has been established. We have enrolled several children this year of former Bethel students. I pray God continues to use the staff and myself to inspire and teach the children to be Christian leaders.



Media and Publications- Elise Holst

Egg Hunt:

This event has hundreds of people from all over the community attend in which over 3000 eggs were hunted, 4 craft areas were enjoyed and fish crackers and lemonade were passed out. This event takes about 10 volunteers who run set up beginning at 6am for the 10am to noon event and cleanup. The hunt was so busy that parking was hard to find and this year a parking leader will have to be used to make sure everyone stays safe and has fun. This event gets bigger every year and now is an event Bethel is known for in the community. Many families have expressed great gratitude that Bethel hosts such a wonderful, welcoming free event for 4 years now.

There has been new additions to the group from time to time as well. A special thanks to Shirley Gross for her dedication to this ministry.

This is the 2nd year of the event (held in late summer) and it includes bringing your pet to be blessed and a bbq lunch. Those who attend enjoy the special one on one blessing and prayer time that Pastor Ben brings to this wonderful event. We have even had those from the community (non-members) join in.

Summer BBQ fun

This event celebrates the opening season of summer and gives the congregation a time to get together before many go their ways in the summer. This year we had a bbq, balloon toss, raffle, and good old fashioned fun.

Chili Cook Off

In 2016 the Quilters completed 263 quilts. Lutheran World Relief received 126 along with 129 school bags. Our quilts have also gone to other groups: 10 to C.O.M.E, Gloria Dei 13, Heritage House 18, San Jose Family Shelter 32, Homeless Men's Ministry 15, Sunnyview Manor 2, Stonecroft Ministry 2, Esperanza International 7 and various Bethel groups 19.

We are celebrating our 20th year making Quilts. In all, our quilt donations total 3986 and 904 school bags. The December 23, 2016 edition of local Cupertino Courier highlighted the Quilters. We were also highlighted on the NBC news website in January 2017. Our group is always looking for new members and clean, gently-used sheets for backing and material. Every Monday morning between 9:15am and 12 noon approximately 22 women meet in the Fireside Room to quilt.

The Women of the ELCA - We met monthly and made blankets for the homeless, donated them to City Team Ministries, San Francisco night ministry, San Jose Family Shelter, Women's rotating shelters, homeless on the street, and made pet blankets for them as well.



Jail Chaplaincy Program- Chris Christensen

CIC (The Jail Chaplain program) continues to minister and serve in both the adult and juvenile detention facilities. In a year where 3 deputies were charged with an inmate murder and where the state continues to send some more hardened inmates back to local community jails, your prayers are greatly appreciated. Juvenile Hall is headed in a very different direction as the population has dropped substantially over the last decade as the courts try not to lock kids up as often or as long.

Chaplains and volunteers offered 2, 178 Christian services in adult facilities and 119 Christian services and 318 bible studies in Juvenile Hall last year.

Did you know that Bethel has an Endowment Fund? This is a fund built from gifts and bequests, where the actual contributions cannot be spent: only the interest or other growth in the value of the fund can be spent. In this way, these contributions can have a permanent beneficial effect on the life of the church.

Bethel's Endowment Fund is called the "Outreach and Education Fund". It is currently about \$128,000 and is invested in a diversified, balanced investment fund administered by the ELCA Foundation. As it grows, distributions are made which are intended to be "visionary" rather than maintaining or supplementing the general budget of the church. As suggested by the name, these distributions are intended to be in the areas of Missions Outreach and Educational work here at Bethel, through the ELCA, or in other ways that seem appropriate.

The Bethel Library equips our congregation to grow their faith by managing over 3,000 books, DVDs and CDs. During the year, 112 new items were added to the collection, many having been donated. Over 200 check-outs were recorded. The annual (and last!) Used Book Sale was held in the Spring. The goal remains to see an increased use of our fine Library.

Faith in Action Rotating Shelter- Alice Isaacson

Bethel is a host church and consortium member of the Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter (faithinactionsv.org). The rotating shelter moves from one host church to another each month and houses up to 15 homeless men. During our month of hosting (typically in May), Bethel provides a secure area for the men to sleep and store their belongings, hot dinners, and groceries for the men to make their breakfasts and lunches. When other churches host the rotating shelter, Bethel provides a hot dinner on the third Sunday of each month. Our church members have been very generous with their time to provide dinners, do laundry, grocery shop for food supplies, and provide hosts to greet the men as they arrive at our shelter. In past years, we have housed the men at our Stelling location; in 2017, we anticipate housing the men at our Finch site. Young Adult Ministry Report- Courtney and Joel Heimbuck

The Young Adult Ministry has celebrated its first year of ministry this summer, led by Courtney and Joel Heimbuck. In the ELCA, young adults are between the ages of post-high school 18 year olds to age 30. Bethel's young adult group is a post high school group for ages 18-35.

Each month, the young adults gather for worship and get together after worship for fellowship with a lunch near church. We average about four to six people for our lunches, with our biggest being eight attendees.

In the spring, the young adults met at homes in the area for Bible studies led by a member of the group or Pastor Ben. The Bible study resource we used was the ELCA's *Faith Lens*, a real-time reflection paired with scripture.

This past winter, the 21+ young adults had its second annual wine tasting. Fun was had by all. We have also developed a specific email address for young adults and a Google group, as a way to connect with everyone.

As 2017 begins some of the goals for this year are to continue our outreach to our young adult community, continue with our spring Bible studies and monthly fellowship lunches, and collaborate with other Lutheran young adult communities in the South Bay for bigger events like service projects or other events.

This ministry could not be a success within its first year without the help of the Bethel community. We thank you for your support. We'd also like to thank Pastor Ben, Adult Ministry Coordinator Patricia Myerholtz for their ministry guidance, and Elise Holst, Dave Arnold and Marianne Nadell for their communication expertise in spreading the word about the Young Adult ministry to our community.
