The Audio/Visual Team supports Sunday worship and all of Bethel's events with technology that enhances them through creative uses of sound and video. Volunteers are needed to run the sound and video systems when needed, as well as possibly helping with video projects as they come along. Learn how to run Media Shout (the software used for projecting worship content on the screens in the Sanctuary). After an initial training period and a period of "shadowing" experienced operators, volunteers can sign up for either worship service.

Children's Activity Bags

Activity bags are provided for our younger children during worship. Volunteers replenish the bags with new activity worksheets for the upcoming service and also maintain the colored pencil sets. The commitment is approximately once every ten weeks and takes less than an hour to complete. A brief training is provided.

The choir meets on Sundays during the 10:45am service beginning after the children's message, during the school year in the Music & Education room. **Attention adults:** we occasionally have a need for substitute accompanists.*

However, a brief training is provided. You would be expected to serve as an usher every Sunday for one month every fourth month.

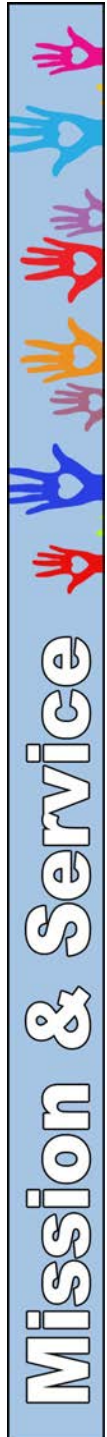
