Opening Devotion / Prayer: Pastor Don Larson	Pastor Don read Psalm 67
Approve Meeting minutes:	Minutes were approved for the Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting September 27th th , 2020.
Pastoral Report: Pr. Don Larson	Through it All, God is Still Here! <i>I can do all things through him who strengthens me. Philippians 4:13</i> is a fitting verse as we have shown we can do many things through God's help and each other. Thank you to everyone who has stepped forward with God doing his work through the Bethel community. Pr. Don is impressed by the Adult Education commitment and engagement and everyone keeping Bethel services and community going "Doing Life Together". At Bethel it is the lay people who are actively doing ministry – and Bethel is doing very well through these challenging times.
Financial Report: Dave Larsen	Thank you for the strong giving into FY21, as the General Fund is currently 7% ahead. Expenses are down 6% due to Bethel being mostly closed with the pandemic. Total income is currently 4% ahead.
2020 Ministry Update: Sue Lampkin	 It is incredible that most of our 81 ministries were able to continue their ministries during the pandemic. Sue encouraged everyone to read the full annual report that is on the Bethel Website. Church Staff ministries – many thanks to their dedication, support and love and the many volunteers that they worked with. Community Events ministries was the thread that kept Bethel together with events every month with creativity, connections, community, love and laughs. Out and About, Bethel Motorcycle group, Supper Clubs, Caring Connections, Labor Day Retreat, Kid Connection, Confirmation, Youth, Choirs, Worship Teams, Adult Education, WOW, Quilters, Men's Night Out and so many other Bethel community groups continued an abundance of activities live until March 2020 and then virtually and social distanced through the year.
Constitution Updates: Liz Tribby	• The Constitution Committee was put together to make changes with closing of Bethel School. Yet the team realized we had not included the 'model constitution' updates from the Synod for the last several years. The team made changes, and then the Synod reviewed as did the Council, and final edits were reviewed through the Synod and Council. The changes must be voted on and approved twice by the congregation before changes go into effect. The changes to Bethel Lutheran Church Constitution were approved in the 1 st vote January 31 st . The final vote will happen at our August congregational meeting.

Call Committee Update: Margit Schmitt	The Ministry Site Profile (MSP) was completed and approved by the Synod at the end of October 2020. We're in the process of waiting as the experts at the Bishop's Office search for candidates for Bethel's next Pastor.
COVID-19 Plan: Tom Hoegel	 Santa Clara County (SCC) is currently in the Purple Tier and we continue to follow those guidelines. Worship is streamed on-line and will stay that way through lent and Easter. Big thanks to Dan Volk who is supporting some active facility needs with an active tenant on site.
