Pastor's Report: Pr. Ben Sandin	<ul> <li>Come. See. Go. Be. – That's referring to the capital campaign, which we began last fall, and continues over the next three years. It is our shared commitment and investment in our life together as we go into the world following God's hope for us.</li> <li>Lenten Journey with Jesus. This year, Lent begins on February 14th. The spiritual time of Lent is for many a time of spiritual growth. Pastor Ben is a believer in using this time to grow in spiritual practices, and encourages us all to join him in this practice.</li> <li>Community Listening Project. – We have a team of people interviewing people living in the community surrounding Bethel, Cupertino, San Jose, Saratoga, Sunnyvale and Santa Clara. The team is asking what it's like to live in this area, and for recommendations of who to interview next. The listening will go on through April, and then be compiled to see what insights and patterns emerge to help guide our decisions about engaging with the community in the future.</li> <li>Generosity. – Pastor Ben gave thanks to Bethel's members for their ongoing generosity, giving of their time, their selves and their possessions.</li> </ul>

Congregational Life: Tom Hogel	<ul> <li>ELCA Youth Gathering – BOOCT Goes South – Bethel Out of Covid Tour 3 – will be attached to the gathering. The trip will be in July of this year. They will visit a plantation run by descendants of former slaves, then to the MLK memorial, the Civil Rights museum and Atlanta. Fundraisers will include Easter Breakfast and the 1-99 board. 12 kids, 3 sponsors, and 5 young adults will be going on the trip.</li> <li>Almost a year ago, a huge storm took out the playground canopies and part of the tree on that side, and they are finally ready to replace them, so there will be shade for the kids in the summer.</li> <li>The Parsonage has been completed, thanks in great part to Mike Coleman and his hard work.</li> <li>Torvend Hall refresh. Torvend is Bethel's original worship space, but needs some work to make it an inviting place to host events for Bethel and the Community. One thing that has been finished is the beam retrofit, so the sagging beams have been supported.</li> <li>Upcoming Congregational events – Out and About events are brainstorming, Labor Day Retreat 2024, Mission to Mexico.</li> </ul>
Endowment Committee: Ralph Miller	<ul> <li>Continuing members are Ralph Miller, Dave Larsen, and Robin Kettner.</li> <li>Margit Schmitt and Mariann Jones have served their term and are outgoing.</li> <li>The fund balance is \$206,000, up 14% in 2023. (Was down 14% in 2022) The fund had \$7,700 in gains (Dividends) which the Endowment Committee would like to distribute as follows.</li> <li>February – \$1,100 towards the remaining First Wednesday education series, as a stipend for non-Bethel presenters and refreshments, and \$1,400 towards travel for the Bethel youth attending the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans and its associated outreach programs this July. The congregation voted to approve this distribution.</li> <li>August – (at the next Congregational Meeting), the remaining \$5,000 will be distributed (pending congregational approval) to projects to be determined by Bethel's Community Engagement Staff member, who will hopefully be hired soon.</li> <li>Also welcome are suggestions from the congregation. Please share with members of the Endowment Committee your thoughts of ways we can make use of the Endowment funds over time.</li> </ul>
